Remembering the Knock Witnesses

Sunday 27 May marks the 75th anniversary of the death of John Curry, the youngest Witness to the Apparition. Aged just 5 years old at the time, John was a native of Lecarrow and was staying with his grandparents, Bryan and Bridget Byrne in the village on that evening. When interviewed in 1937 for the 2nd Commission of Enquiry (specially convened in New York to hear his testimony), John stated: "I remember the 21st of August 1879 as well as I do last night". John's remains were reinterred in 2017 in the cemetery at Old St. Patrick's Cathedral, New York and he will be remembered at 9am Mass on **Sunday 27 May in Knock Parish Church**, the church in which he was baptised.
