The reason I believe in the Resurrection is the many testimonies from those who saw him in the flesh so to speak, from Thomas who like us wasn't willing just to take someone's word for it as well as not actually finding his body, this is at least an invitation to dig deeper into the mystery of faith and open our minds to extraordinary possibilities. As N.T. Wright, the New Testament scholar puts it: "Jesus' resurrection is the beginning of God's new project not to snatch people away from earth to heaven but to colonize earth with the life of heaven."

Wishing you all a very happy and joy filled Easter – He is Risen, alleluia!
