will we examine in detail. We will also glance at the work of other artists asking how they depicted the Virgin and how they represented the Holy Family. Artists discussed and shown include:- Bellini, Botticelli, Bruegel, Caravaggio,

Fra Angelico, Ghirlandaio, Leonardo da Vinci and Murillo.

Lecture 2: Saturday 16th December

'With Respect to Art; Looking at the Miracle that is Christmas'

The second lecture will think about a variety of images of the Nativity. It will take a hop, skip and a

jump across a diverse range of paintings that depict various aspects and moments in this wonderful event. It is hoped that these images open the door to admit us to a deeper, broader and more reverent understanding of what Christmas might mean to the thinking Christian.

The artists and work featured will include: Federico Barocci, Velasquez, de la Tour, Rembrandt, van der Goes, Gozzoli, Caravaggio, Michelangelo and Paula Rego.


